Parking Lot & Drop Off Zone Issues - Mrs. Whittam

PHONE NUMBER, ADDRESS AND EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION.

Please advise the Office if you have recently moved or changed your phone number. Also, please advise us if you have new emergency contact information. This information is helpful in the event that your child is injured or sick at school and needs to be picked up. Besides family members, if possible, place a few trusted neighbors or family friends on the list. This way, there is someone to pick up your child even if there is a family emergency. Always make children aware of who is on the emergency contact list and who has permission to pick them up.

February's Virtue is Fairness

This month, we focused on the virtue of fairness. We learned that fairness means following the rules, being sincere, trustworthy, and truthful. We practice fairness by treating each other the way we want to be treated. We don't judge people by what others say and we don't find fault or talk about someone behind their back. Fairness means we get what we deserve. Everyone gets their fair share. It is fair to receive a consequence or punishment when we do something wrong so we will remember to do things differently next time. It is also fair to be rewarded and recognized when we are doing something right and doing our best. We learned that being fair takes courage and sometimes when we show our fairness, we stand alone. When we show fairness, people will want to be around us because they know that we are truthful and they can trust and depend on us. Fair people make good friends.
