FOR THOSE PARENTS THAT PROVIDE BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL CARE SERVICES -

During Kindergarten registration, there were a number of parents asking for names of before and after school care providers. We welcome anyone to post their information on our Community Board (located by the Computer Lab) or you can call the Office and give us details. Thank you!

Kindergarten Registration (2018-19)

January 29 to February 2, 2018 - 8am to 3pm

Registration for students who will turn five before December 31, 2018 (born in 2013) will take place from January 29 to February 2 at all School District #61 schools. Parents are asked to register their child at the **catchment school** during this week. To determine your catchment, either go to the school locator on the district website at www.sd61.bc.ca/schoolLocator.aspx or call the district board office at 250-475-3212. To request an out-of-catchment school within the District, register at your catchment school and complete a Kindergarten Transfer Application form. Below is the required documentation to register:

School Age Eligibility and Citizenship

A child must reach five years of age by December 31st of the school year to be eligible for enrolment. Documentation can include:

- ☑ Child's original Birth Certificate
- ☑ Canadian Passport

- ☑ Landed Immigrant authorization
- ☑ Indigenous and Northern Affairs Status Card

Parents of children who are not Canadian Citizens, Landed Immigrants, or do not have a birth certificate for their child must contact the International Student Program by calling 250.592.6871, prior to registration.

Proof of Residential Address

Every home address in the Greater Victoria School District is connected to a catchment school. Students must register at their catchment school. To determine which schools are associated with a home address, visit the **School Locator Tool** at **www.sd61.bc.ca**. Type in the address and it will indicate which school the student should attend based on their residential address.

For Home Owners

Two current copies of the following documents are required:

- Purchase agreement of home
- ☑ Property tax statement
- ☑ Home owner's insurance
- ☑ Notice of Assessment
- ☑ A purchase agreement (with subject removal and a deposit receipt if a recent purchase)

If a homeowner can only produce one of the above, they must also produce two of the following:

- Canadian bank or credit card statement
- ☑ BC vehicle registration
- ☑ Income tax statement
- ☑ Insurance documents

For Renters

To provide proof of home address the following is required:

☑ A rental agreement signed by landlord with landlords contact phone number

In addition, two of the following are required:

- ☑ Canadian bank or credit card statement
- ☑ BC vehicle registration
- ☑ Income tax statement
- ☑ Renters Insurance documents

Grade 4 Students - Foundation Skills Assessment (FSA)

Grade 4 students were involved in the annual provincial FSA assessments that provide a snapshot of how well students are doing in the basic skills of Reading Comprehension, Writing and Numeracy. Middle School Parent Information Nights

Northridge Elementary School is part of the Spectrum Family of Schools. Northridge catchment students will move through the following pathway schools - Glanford Middle School (Gr. 6-8) and Spectrum Community School (Gr. 9-12). Middle School parent information nights are on the following evenings:

Glanford: Tuesday, January 30 7:00-8:30p.m. (pathway school for Northridge catchment students)

Colquitz: Wednesday, February 7 at 7 p.m.

For students wishing to attend a school other than their catchment school, a student transfer application form will need to be filled out during the student transfer process week (February 15-23).

Student Transfer Process for K-12

The annual K-12 Student Transfer Process facilitates requests from students in Kindergarten to Grade 12 to transfer to schools outside of a designated catchment. To apply for a transfer request you must provide all required documentation and complete a form at the student's current school in the week of February 15-23, 2018.

For students who are not in catchment and looking to follow their school pathway at the time of transition from elementary to middle and middle to secondary (Grades 5 and 8), will now have to apply for a transfer request. Non-catchment students no longer automatically follow their current school pathway.

In the event, a school receives more transfer requests by grade than the number of seats it can accommodate, the waitlist order of transfer requests will be determined by lottery in accordance with our student enrolment priorities. Therefore, there is no advantage of submitting your transfer request first. Please submit your request at your convenience during the communicated dates.

Do you know that reading books to babies and preschoolers is the most significant indicator of early school success? Cuddling and reading to your little ones shows that you value reading, builds comfort, enjoyment and early skills that last a lifetime.

Help make that true for those still to gain those habits. **January 27 is National Literacy Day.** As well as enjoying a new story with your child, please make an extra effort to drop of gently used picture books for babies and preschoolers in the drop box just outside the Northridge library. All very young children benefit from being read to – help make that a reality for more. Thank you for being part of the 150,000 books donated over the last eight years.

Child, Youth and Family Community Health provides immunization clinics throughout the year for Kindergarten aged children.

The following are the most common vaccines given to children at this age. Some children may be missing some vaccines and have not completed their childhood immunizations. Public Health Nurses or Family Physicians can ensure that your child is fully immunized against the following vaccine preventable diseases.

Vaccine	Vaccine Schedule	
Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis and Polio (given in one shot)	Most children in kindergarten are due for this vaccine.	
Varicella (Chickenpox)	Most children in kindergarten are due for a second dose of this vaccine. Children who have had chickenpox disease or shingles when they were over one year of age do not need this vaccine. Children who had chickenpox disease when they were younger than one year of age OR who have never had chickenpox disease should have already been given 1 dose of this vaccine and now need a second dose.	
Hepatitis B	Most children in kindergarten should have already been given 3 doses of this vaccine.	
Measles, Mumps and Rubella (given in one shot)	Most children in kindergarten should have already been given 2 doses of this vaccine.	
Meningococcal C	Most children in kindergarten should have already been given 1 dose of this vaccine.	
Hepatitis A	Aboriginal children can be given 2 doses of this vaccine.	

All of these vaccines are provided free of charge by the health unit or your family doctor. To check your child's immunization status or to make an appointment, phone your local health unit. For more information contact:
