Northridge Elementary Expansion - At the January 29th Board meeting, the Board of Education has approved up to \$350,000 for a permanent classroom space to be built at Northridge Elementary. The District received funding from the Ministry as part of the Classroom Enhancement Fund (CEF) capital envelope and additional monies were received from the Ministry of Children and Families on behalf of the out of school care provider. The concept is to have two additional spaces added to the current school.

#### Parking Lot & Drop Off Zone Issues - Mrs. Naughton

PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF ONLY NO PARKING A reminder to all parents that parking cars in the drop off zone is not allowed. We have a few drivers that are continually violating this space. This results in confusion as other drivers must veer wide to avoid parked vehicles. Additionally, drivers have been noted turning left out of our parking lot and through the crosswalk on Carey Road. Our patrols have been trained to follow the rules and when drivers disregard posted signage, the result is confusion and danger.

Also, the staff parking lot is <u>out of bounds</u>. The odd space that may be available is for our many itinerant staff who arrive at various times of the day. We all know that parking availability is extremely limited however we must live with our situation. Please respect the drop-off zone and staff parking lot including the handicap parking stalls. As well, please do not park in front of property owners' driveways along Ridgebank and Oakridge Crescent. Thank you for your cooperation and keeping our children safe.

#### PHONE NUMBER, ADDRESS AND EMERGENCY CONTACT INFORMATION.

Please advise the Office if you have recently moved or changed your phone number. Also, please advise us if you have new emergency contact information. This information is helpful in the event that your child is injured or sick at school and needs to be picked up. Besides family members, if possible, place a few trusted neighbors or family friends on the list. This way, there is someone to pick up your child even if there is a family emergency. Always make children aware of who is on the emergency contact list and who has permission to pick them up.

#### Basketball Program

The students in Grade 4 & 5 have enjoyed an excellent season of basketball. Skills were taught in November and December and games have been ongoing twice weekly after school in January, February and March and will wrap up on Friday, March 16 at lunchtime with a championship match. # What is Stress Behaviour?

Modern science is showing that there is a HUGE difference between misbehaviour and stress behaviour.

It's critical for teachers to understand this distinction because if we treat them in the same way, it can be worse for our students—and is very hard on everyone!

#### Misbehaviour

The key to misbehaviour is that the child could have acted differently: that she was aware that she shouldn't have done something, and was perfectly capable of acting differently.

#### Stress behaviour

The key to stress behaviour is that the child is not fully aware of what she is doing, or why: she has limited capacity to act differently.

Stress behaviour is caused by too high a stress-local The big challenge in doing Self-Reg is figuring out why the child's stress is so high.

# 5 Primary Domains of Stress

- Biological noises, crowds, too much visual stimulation, not enough exercise
- Emotional—strong emotions, both positive (over-excited) & negative (anger, fear)
- Cognitive—difficulty processing certain kinds of information
- \* Social—difficulty picking up on social cues, or understanding the effect of his behaviour on others
- Prosocial—difficulty coping with other peoples' stress



# Signs of Stress Behaviour

- Heightened impulsivity
- Difficulty ignoring distractions
- 3 Problems in mood (sees everything negatively)
- 4 Erratic mood swings
- **Trouble listening**
- 6 What she is saying doesn't make sense
